Excellent motorway connections, a well-qualified workforce, rich quality of life and an outstanding array of commercial and industrial facilities make this the perfect choice for your business.

Located in the north of Gloucestershire, the borough includes parts of the Severn Vale and the Cotswolds Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty and stretches south to the outskirts of Gloucester and Cheltenham.

It encompasses the riverside town of Tewkesbury, many enchanting Cotswold and Severn Vale villages and the historic town of Winchcombe. The centres of Brockworth, Bishop's Cleeve and Churchdown offer quality housing and a range of services.

Despite its apparently rural character, the borough is an established investment location and includes a wide range of economic activity, ranging from large multinationals to micro businesses. These businesses benefit from a wide choice of sites and premises, including strategic business parks to high quality rural business centres.

The borough leads the way for industry, both in recognised key sectors and potential growth sectors. It is also an established centre for high quality manufacturing and is home to some world class high-tech aero-engineering firms. The tourism sector is also increasingly important, particularly for the rural economy.

Excellent national and international transport links provide easy access to markets, supply chains and customers making this an ideal area to locate and thrive in.

The area boasts an outstanding road network and includes junctions 9, 10, 11 and 11a of the M5 motorway, providing direct links to Birmingham, Bristol and the south west. Travel to the north and London is also made easy by the excellent links with the M6 and M4. Junction 1 of the M50 also provides convenient access to south Wales.

There is a useful rail link at Ashchurch for Tewkesbury Station, within easy access of the M5 and Tewkesbury town. This enables rail links between Bristol and Birmingham, eastwards to Swindon and London, and westwards through the Forest of Dean to Cardiff.

The borough is home to Gloucestershire Airport, which can provide for your business travel needs. The regional airports at Bristol, Cardiff, Birmingham and Heathrow are also easily accessible and between one or two hours away.

Major investment is being made in broadband connections through the Borders Broadband project and rollout of the new network will be completed by the end of 2016.

The economic profile of the borough paints a brighter picture than in many areas of the UK today. The area offers highly skilled workers, a higher economic activity rate than the national average and a low unemployment rate, which can help give your business a head start.

The borough has a population of 82,300 which is expected to see significant growth in the future, providing a strong future labour supply.

The economic activity rate of the area is 83.9% and is higher than the county, regional and national rates representing a healthy labour market and 62% of the population are of working age.

Business enterprise in the area is high and growing with over 3500 registered businesses. High business start-up rates also enhance competitiveness and performance.

Business survival rates continue to be the highest in the county and exceed regional and national rates. The number of businesses which have been established for 10 years is also above the national average, demonstrating the borough is a proven environment to develop and grow your business.

skills for success

The borough's excellent location combined with the outstanding quality of life make it easy to attract and retain employees. This draws businesses to the area as they recognise there is ready access to a good supply of labour.

The local workforce is highly qualified with over a third educated to degree level or above, higher than the county, regional and national average. The diverse economic profile of the area also means the workforce is used to working flexibly with the ability to adapt to the needs of new investors.

In terms of future talent, the University of Gloucestershire provides a rich supply of graduates across a variety of disciplines. Launchpad Skills Centre is also perfectly based on Tewkesbury Business Park to provide for vocational training needs.

When it comes to on-going skills development residents and businesses have easy access to outstanding education and training facilities. The nearby University of Gloucestershire and Gloucestershire College boast business development departments, providing a wealth of corporate training and research services.

We also work closely with partner organisations to ensure any local developments or investment can increase job opportunities for local people.





business diversity

Structurally the economy of the area is diverse and well balanced with no over dependence on one sector or firm.

There is a clear strength in manufacturing and a tradition in aerospace and advanced engineering, which continues to this day with a cluster of precision engineering, medical device, automotive and aerospace businesses.

Other significant sectors are distribution, finance, IT and other business services and public administration. Tourism also continues to play an important role in the rural borough.

The dynamic economy of the area is reflected in the presence of key growth sectors. The borough has witnessed one of the highest growth rates in the creative industries sector, outperforming county, regional and national level increases.

The knowledge economy is also particularly strong and has seen higher growth than at county, regional and national levels, with an impressive cluster of knowledge-based businesses now complementing existing sectors.

Innovative activity is abundant in the area, derived through the growth of the knowledge economy and this reflects the area's high-tech engineering and manufacturing base.

a proven business location

The borough provides a ready supply of high quality office, industrial, warehouse and retail accommodation, as well as key development sites in strategic locations.

Over 30 key employment sites provide choice and flexibility to meet the needs of all business types and sizes. These range from large strategic business parks to the smaller rural business centres.

Mixed use sites at Tewkesbury benefit from proximity to the M5 and provide high specification industrial and warehouse units, as well as quality office space, which are home to both multinationals and SMEs.

Gloucester Business Park, a 276 acre mixed use site, located directly off 11a of the M5, boasts the largest area of available employment land in the borough. Premises include high quality office space and modern large scale industrial and warehouse units.

There is a cluster of business parks in the Staverton area, all are well maintained mixed use parks with a range of unit sizes. Aerospace related businesses have a clear presence and Gloucestershire Airport offers accommodation particularly appealing to aviation related businesses.




The rural industrial estates located across the borough are very popular and areas of high activity, providing light industrial and workshop units.



The area boasts many delightful villages, retail centres and historic market towns. These offer a wealth of facilities for shopping, eating out, leisure and cultural activities.
