

Data requests under the Data Protection Act 2018 Privacy Notice

Why we collect information about you?

The council collects personal information about you in order to process your data request and provide you with a response.

We will also need to process your personal information if you ask us to review the way that we have handled your request or if you make a complaint to the Information Commissioners Office.

We will use your information to verify your identity where required and to contact you by post, email or telephone regarding your request.

What information do we collect about you?

We collect the following information about you:

- Name
- Address
- Date of birth
- Telephone number
- Email address
- Previously known name (where applicable)
- Previously known address (where applicable)
- Identification e.g. passport, driving license etc
- National Insurance Number (where applicable)
- Signature (where authorising an individual or organisation to act on your behalf)

Our legal basis for processing

Processing your personal information is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest by the council and to ensure compliance with our legal obligations under the Data Protection Act 2018.

Who do we share the information with?

Your information is shared internally with the relevant council department(s) to fulfil your request and provide you with a response.

In some cases we will require to send information to our shared services- Building Control (shared service with Cheltenham Borough Council) and our One Legal Services.

Where you make a complaint to the UK Information Commissioner we are legally obliged to share your information with them.

Is any information transferred to or stored on servers based outside the European Economic Area (EAA)?

We do not transfer any of your personal information outside the European Economic Area (EEA).

How long do we keep your information?

We will keep your information for 1 year from the date the response was sent.

Who do we collect information from?

We collect information either directly from yourself or from a representative acting on your behalf.

What are the consequences if we do not collect the data?

Without obtaining this information we are unable to process your request and provide you with a response.

Are any decisions about you made by automatic means?

No.

Your rights as a data subject

By law, you have a number of rights as a data subject, and this does not take away or reduce these rights.

These rights are:

- Request access to your personal information (commonly known as a "data subject
 access request"). This enables you to receive a copy of the personal information we
 hold about you and to check that we are lawfully processing it.
- Request correction of the personal information that we hold about you. This
 enables you to have any incomplete or inaccurate information we hold about you
 corrected.
- Request erasure of your personal information. This enables you to ask us to delete
 or remove personal information where there is no good reason for us continuing to
 process it. You also have the right to ask us to delete or remove your personal
 information where you have exercised your right to object to processing (see below).
- **Object to processing** of your personal information where we are relying on a legitimate interest (or those of a third party) and there is something about your particular situation which makes you want to object to processing on this ground.
- Request the restriction of processing of your personal information. This enables you
 to ask us to suspend the processing of personal information about you, for example if
 you want us to establish its accuracy or the reason for processing it.
- Request the transfer of your personal information to another party.

All information is processed in accordance with Tewkesbury Borough Council's data protection policy.
